What do the boys study?

A wide range of core subjects so that options are kept open at this stage.

- English
- Maths
- Science
- History
- Computing
- PSHCE

What do the boys study?

Two optional subjects:

- Ancient History
- Latin
- Greek (for beginners)
- Drama
- Music

- A new language:
 - German
 - Spanish
 - Mandarin Chinese



Science

- Biology, Chemistry and Physics (Engineering) taught by specialist teachers
- One lesson per week each of Biology and Chemistry
- Three lessons per fortnight of Engineering

Modern Languages

- German or French as a continuing language
- Spanish, German or Chinese as beginners' languages
- It may be possible to pick up French having studied German in 2nd Year.
- Must continue with at least one European
 Foreign Language for GCSE

Setting

- Taught in ability sets for Maths and Latin from the start of term. Summer exams are used as a guide.
- French is set by ability after the first term.
- Other subjects are taught in mixed ability groups

Considerations

- Some combinations may prove to be impossible to timetable
- It is sometimes necessary to withdraw an option if numbers are uneconomical
- Think ahead to the 4th year


