On Thursday 6 June, the 4th Year Academic Scholars will be going on a trip to Portsmouth to visit the historic dockyard, and visit the Mary Rose, HMS Victory, and other things. Mr Middleton will be writing to you with more details before half term. Also, later this term, we will be launching the summer projects for current 3rd and 4th Year scholars in the normal fashion. All these students will be asked to research a short presentation on a subject of their choice over the summer which they will then deliver to the other scholars in their year group in the early part of the Michaelmas Term. We expect all the academic scholars to take part (it is optional for other pupils in the year), and we hope that they will seize this opportunity to develop their independent study skills. The best projects will receive generous rewards as well as having the opportunity to present them to fellow pupils and parents next term.
