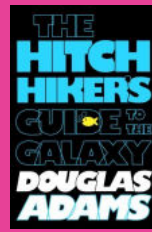
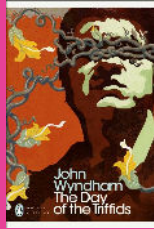
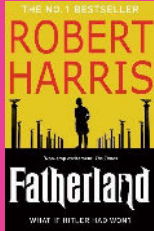
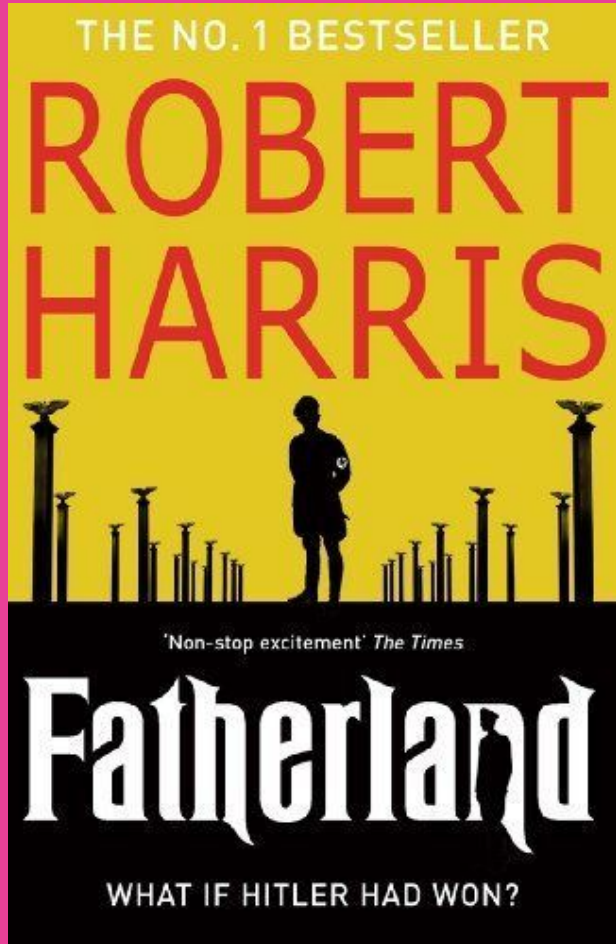


Books worth a second look

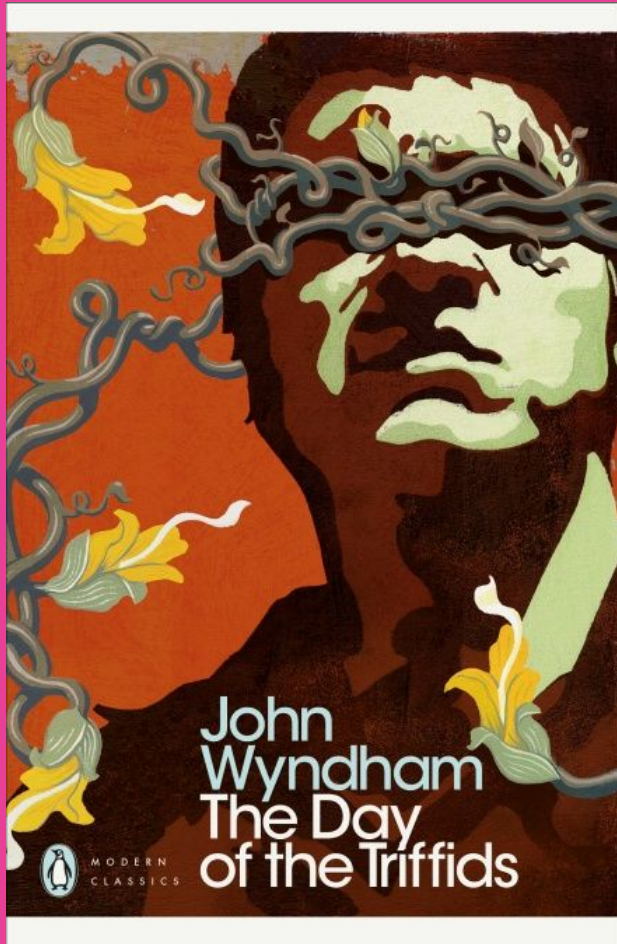

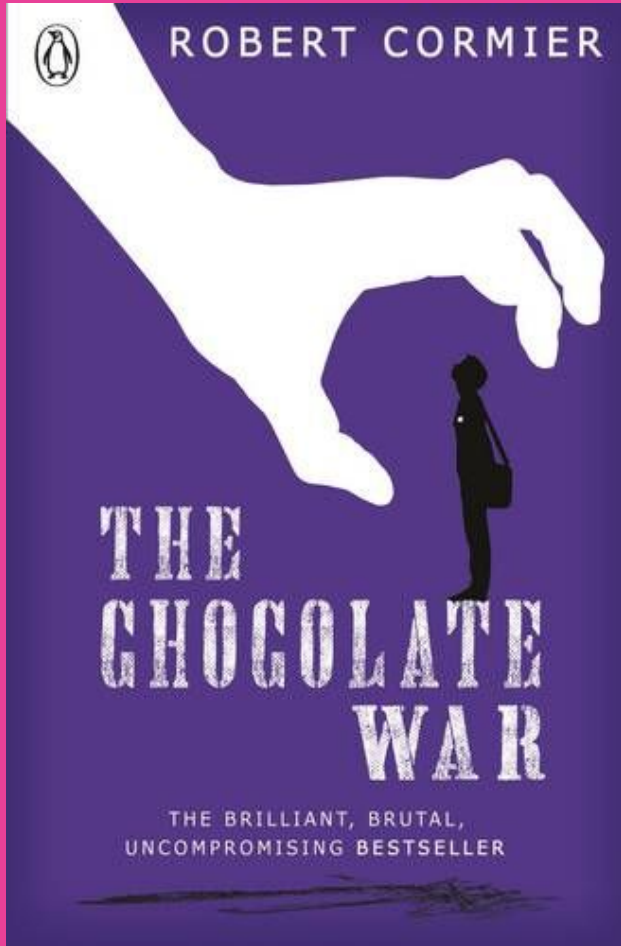
Her attempts to maintain the uneasy balance between them are shattered when Starr is the only witness to the fatal shooting of her best friend by a police officer.

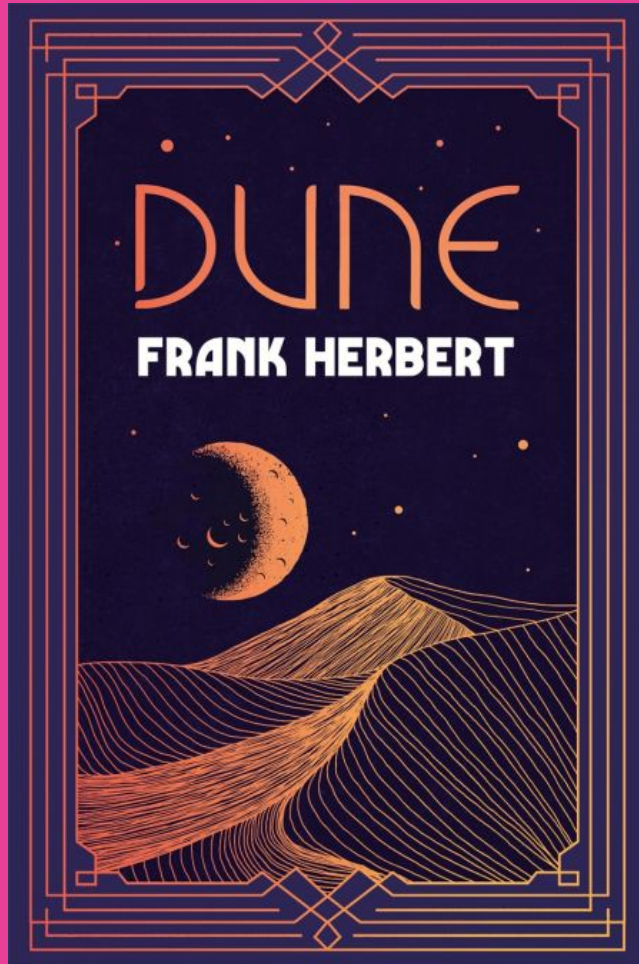

It's a classic tale of David vs Goliath. Except that this time, David is not going to win.

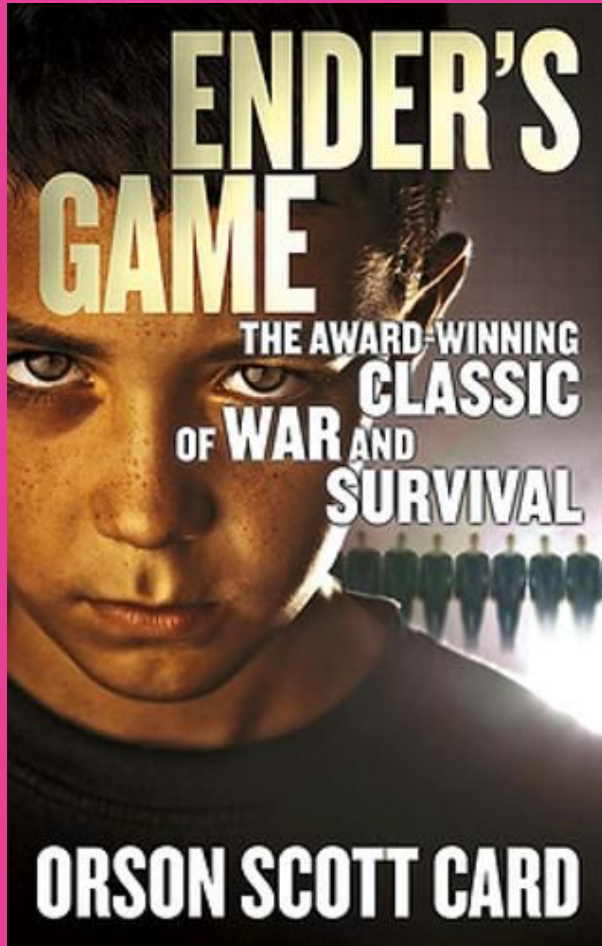



As his successes mount and he proceeds to Battle School, it seems that Ender is the one they're all looking for. But at what cost? Is he becoming a hero - or a monster?



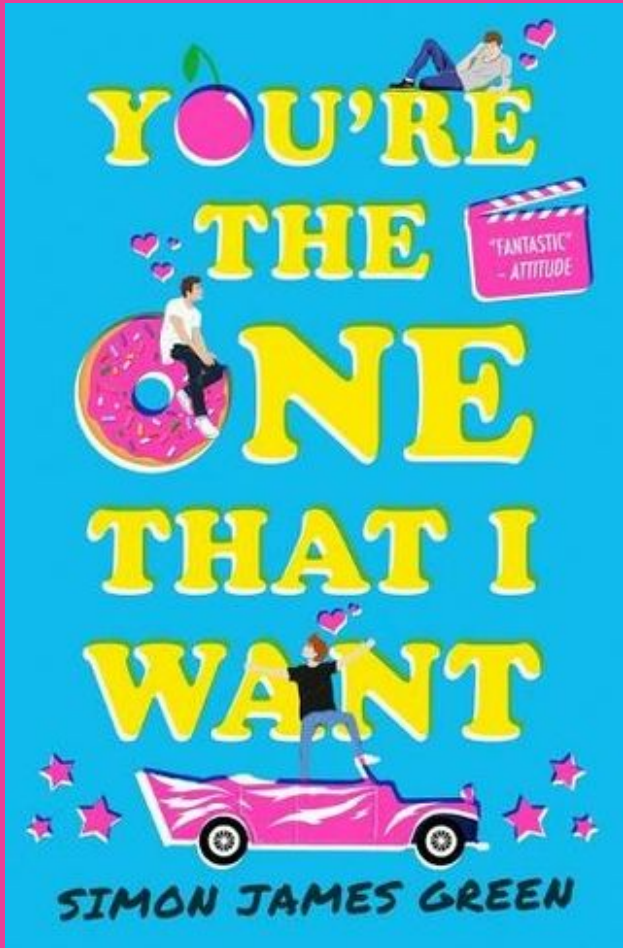

Go with them to learn the true value of towels, two-headed aliens, paranoid androids, and the answer to life, the universe and everything...



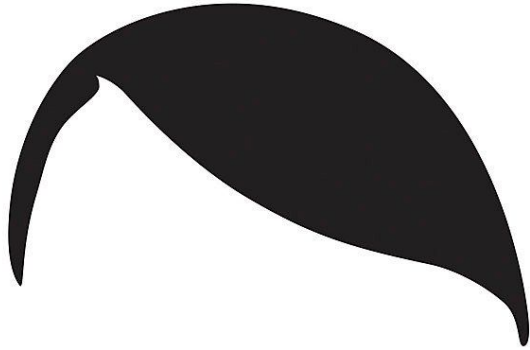
Freddie doesn't stand out in any way. Teachers and fellow students keep forgetting who he is. Even his mum thinks he's a disappointment.
