

























Ryland is on a desperate, last-chance mission. If he fails, humanity and the earth itself will perish.




Everyone at Fairvale Academy knows

Until one boy risks everything.


Because brilliant Bryson Keller forgot one thing. When he accepted the dare, he never said it could only be girls...



Kay Caton-Walsh is an officer in a unit of WAAFs on a mission to newly liberated Belgium, attempting to locate and destroy the V2 launch sites.



But the Führer has another programme, one with even greater ambition - to set the Fatherland he finds a shambles back to rights...




Julius Caesar has been assassinated. A nation is in mourning. Revenge will be bloody.








His friends know exactly what they want out of life, but Scott Ferdowsi can hardly commit to a breakfast cereal, let alone a passion.
