


Zaynab is from a country devastated by war. Lucas is from rural Devon, which might as well be a world away. When they meet, they discover a common cause: the climate crisis.

Now both Zaynab and Lucas are in danger, leaving Lucas having to grapple with divided loyalties and the true cost of friendship.....




A boy. A wolf. The legend lives on...


An unlikely friendship. A dangerous voyage. A story about what it means to be human.

Forced to examine everything they've believed, XR_395's life suddenly stops being so simple...




The Secret Diary of Adrian Mole Aged 13 3/4 is the first book in Sue Townsend's brilliantly funny Adrian Mole series.




But because Alan is still suffering the effects of his coma, he tends to, well, fall asleep at the worst possible moments, So Darkus might just have to solve this mystery all by himself.

Thirteen-year-old Buddy is struggling. His mum and dad argue constantly. Usually the arguments are about his dad, an ageing rocker, interested only in Elvis Presley and motorbikes, working the fringes of the criminal underworld.
